# **Executive Summary**

Each academic year an Exit Survey is offered to all students applying to receive a certificate or degree from Tulsa Community College. The purpose of this report is to present the summary findings of the 2022-2023 Exit Survey, including the general demographics of students completing degrees and certificates during the year.

The Exit Survey (Appendix A) is designed to shed light on the following questions:

- To what extent do students feel their experience at TCC contributed to their development of broad learning skills, analytical skills, interpersonal/relationship skills, and goal setting?
- How satisfied were students with the educational services and the interpersonal interactions they experienced at TCC?
- What were students' goals for attending TCC and did they accomplish them?
- How do students rate their TCC experience compared to other institutions?
- What are students' plans for future education and employment after graduation?

During the 2022-2023 academic year (Summer 2022, Fall 2022, Spring 2023), 2,829 certificates and degrees were conferred to 2,433 individual students. Of the completing students, 56.3% were 18 to 24 years old and 66.6% were female. Of the degrees conferred, 74.4% of awards were university transfer degrees (Associate of Arts, Associate of Science). Of the students filing for graduation, 900 students completed the Exit Survey 2022-2023, representing a 31.8% response rate. The following points are a summary of the major findings from this survey.

- The majority of respondents strongly agreed that TCC contributed to their development of learning skills, analytical skills, goal setting, and interpersonal/relationship skills. The item receiving the highest percentage of strong agreement was the ability to learn effectively on their own (66.4%). The lowest percentage of strong agreement (46.4%) was associated with contributing to the welfare of the community.
- The majority of respondents (53.0%) believe the instruction they received in major courses was high quality.
- 36.2% of respondents strongly agreed to the statement "I was able to get involved with organization(s) or event(s) that were of interest to me."
- 31.0% of respondents strongly agreed to the statement "The programs, organizations, or events in Student Life helped me become a more well-rounded person."
- The majority of students (74.2%) either strongly agreed or somewhat agreed they learned about different cultures, ideas, and/or types of diversity.
- 77.7% either strongly agreed or somewhat agreed that TCC was inclusive of their thoughts, ideas, and/or identities.

- The top educational goals set for attending TCC were to earn a degree or certificate, transfer to a 4-year college/university, and prepare for getting a job (86.8%, 46.7%, and 24.0%, respectively). 76.8% of students indicated they had accomplished their goal(s) for attending TCC.
- ◆ 46.8% of student respondents indicated they had attended another institution.
  - Of students who indicated they had attended another institution, 38.0% believed TCC was better than other institutions they had attended. 56.8% believed TCC was about the same.
- The majority of respondents (94.7%) indicated that if they were to start college over again, they would probably or definitely enroll at TCC.
- Of all respondents, 44.1% of students indicated they would be transferring to a 4-year institution.
- The top four-year institutions identified for transfer were: NSU, OSU, and OU (27.6%, 25.1%, and 11.7%, respectively).
- 34.3% of students indicated they would begin or continue in a job related to their degree or certificate.
- The comparison of the average response to scaled items between the 2022-2023 survey and the 2021-2022 survey showed only slight variations from year to year.

# Survey Methodology

Beginning the fall semester of 2016, an online graduate application process was implemented. The new process includes a link to the Exit Survey as an option for applicants to complete. The digital version of the Exit Survey was delivered through Qualtrics (see Appendix A). All program graduates were offered the survey link as part of the graduate application process for the Summer 2022, Fall 2022, and Spring 2023 (N = 2,829). A total of 900 individuals completed the survey, for a response rate of 31.8%. The summary of responses follows.

I really hate your new security upgrade for logging in. Its a huge pain and is causing a big delay.

I was upset all the time if I was not crying, I was so mad and depressed did not want to go to school and deal with people.

Maybe make future events more public to get others involved. It seemed a bit difficult to find a group I would have been interested in.

My major feedback for Tulsa Community College is that, despite the term "Community" in its name, the school does not seem to cater to individuals in all stages of life, particularly working adults. While it may appear inclusive, the majority of their courses appear to be geared towards traditional students, resulting in limited flexibility when it comes to timelines and due dates. This rigidity makes it challenging for individuals with other responsibilities to manage their coursework. The expectations seem to be primarily designed for recent high school graduates with few job or life obligations, rather than accommodating the diverse needs of working adults. As a result, TCC does not offer the necessary support to working adults seeking to further their education.

the school does not help working students because you need to offer more classes at night. The internship needs to be set up for full-time working students. The volunteer work that was required for these classes was not volunteer work it was voluntold

Volunteer work is something you want to do not required to do.

The STUDENT VOICE should be stronger and there should be a student help desk at each campus to help student navigate new student or old student problems, issues and concerns instead of the student having to call and hunt for help and answers. I also do not like that you have call 211 instead of letting student be transferred to different departments as needed. Additionally, there should be better payment terms for students as well as more grants for students that need financial help to pay for school. I am very disappointed in the experience TCC student. The professors do not listen to our concerns about our poor education and lack of preparation for real world experiences.

I don't think some teachers are held accountable as much as they should be. Example assignments that are turned in should be graded before the due date of the next one so that proper feed back can be obtained. If its not done then the assignment is postponed.

I just feel it became very heavy when it came to attending class for hours a night then still having to do countless amount of homework

I like to see TCC go back to total face to face or in person classes. My Electronic classes are blended and I have a hard time completing my assignments.

I previously attended a different community College who not only had more resources such as a cadaver lab for anatomy and physiology courses, but I also did not encounter professors like I have at TCC. These professors I have encountered at TCC are different because they have not been as dedicated to teaching or have simply not been very effective teachers. I took the same course in Phoenix with a much more dedicated professor and wouldn't have performed as well in this course of not for the previous one.

I THINK THE READING ASSIGNMENTS ARE A LITTLE TOO MUCH FOR WORKING ADULTS.

I was pretty disappointed with the classes offered in the spring 2023 semester. As someone who is ready to start my career, it was highly important that I graduated on time. However, the classes offered were very limited. More specifically, a 3D course was not offered. As a working student, it's important to have the classes I need offered so I can graduate on time. My major focuses on 3D design, and I was surprised when a 3D course was not offered. If it wasn't for the help of the Engineering Technology professors, I would have had to push my graduation date to the end of Fall 2023.

I would say that it was fine, but I do wish there were more classes in person in my major. I am an introvert so not having to see people and be in person all the time was fine, but I know that it would've been better for me to get out more and meet new people. When I had some in person classes one semester, I actually met some people that I got along with or wanted to get to know more, but then the next semester after that everything was only online again and it just wasn't the same connection. It just honestly didn't feel like college but just remote work.

I'm a little disappointed I did not get to complete my English degree due to the classes not being offered online. I work full time and was not able to make it to any in person classes. But I'm glad it worked out for me to end my time at TCC and still get a Liberal Arts degree out of it.

Many professors are not realistic on their completion times. They seem not to understand that some of us work 40 hours a week on top of taking 12 hours of classes.

My experience overall was okay, I got what I came here for. The only thing that I have any complaint about was the amount of instructors that complain about the Tulsa Achieves program and how it has made students lazy. The instructors will complain about students from Broken Arrow public schools constantly and how the overall the education in Oklahoma has suffered in the past years. I am not from Oklahoma, so I didn't receive my education here. But it can be so unmotivating hearing that from instructors so I can only imagine how actual Oklahoma public school system students feel.

#### Negative comments related to instruction\* (N=20) (Continued)

Professors need to say on day 1 of class if they do or do not allow notes for mathematics tests.

Some professors have been...negligent leaving me to "teach myself". However, that's something that I've come to accept. Being fully online takes a lot of discipline to want to succeed and to finish.

The pandemic greatly affected my education; a lot of activities/labs simply weren't offered and more traditionally hands-on courses were transitioned online or hybrid.

The professor of my current class uses far too many words than is needed to communicate his meaning or instructions. God bless PHD candidates!

There seems to be a moral issues among some of the staff. Sometime sit felt that they had lost their drive and passion.

This semester was absolutely abysmal. There was nothing to learn from half my professors, and they would just tell me to read the book or parrot what was in the book.

(although I know that is a great program and a needs profession. But so are others) My experience with TCC was pretty great, until I entered the last two semesters of my accounting degree. The business department here is a wreck and not student oriented at all. I reached out to instructors, board members as well as the dean of business with genuine concern and I felt that I was completely unheard, and that none of them seem to care about the student's perspective.

Negative comments related to services\* (N=13)

Academic advisors almost caused me not to graduate by not telling me the correct order to take my classes in and professors are so busy with their other jobs they barley have time to teach their classes or grade a single thing all semester.

employees were rude and disrespectable when you talk to them. They did not help me.

Had a hard time understanding the rules and they people that were talking to me. most of them were rude and disrespectable.

Hire people who are not so rude for the office

I enrolled at TCC because of the BMET certificate option however, students were told that the college will be dissolving this option in 2024.

What left a horrible impression about TCC was the lack of assistance when seeking help to learn concepts in the AC class and other electricity classes. I sought assistance several times and no one knew how to do the activities, assignments or lab work. People in the math lab were not able to assist. My classmates and I had the will and made the effort to seek assistance. A huge suggestion is to hire someone who has background knowledge who can help or offer electronic tutorials.

I had a lot of trouble getting together with an advisor. This is my 3rd advisor in 2 years in the same program.

I have had issues ever since the beginning when it came to support regarding me being a student against TCC, not so much the professors. Yes, some of the professors never really gave a care about how things should be done. Over the last 3 years, it became known that TCC was going downhill, and I was being cared less about with my success. Thankfully, I have at least two professors from Fall 2022 who are willing to push through to get me graduated with a degree I rightfully have earned.

I was not informed that i could have achieved a second degree if I had taken a few more pre-req classes until I was filling out my graduation application. I feel this should have been upfront information provided when enrolling in the career mobility courses.

I wish my advisor would have told me before my last semester that I was only one class shy for a double degree. My accademic advisor is not professional and dis not help me when I needed

My experience with financial aid was horrible. The department was not willing to help with my unique situation until I reached out to the president of TCC. My wife and I ended up right contrary to what the financial aid department was willing to tell us.

My second academic advisor after XXXX has not really done her job and hasn't helped me.

The Financial aid process is a joke, with everything lined up, I have had numerous semesters where my funding didn't come through until the middle of the semester. At other schools I have attended I had my disbursement writhing the first week and even a week before classes started. Additionally, the turn over with advisors is absolutely astounding.. my current advisor often couldn't answer any questions I had about my program and thus, I had to rely on my program coordinator to have guidance.
