Tulsa Community College 2022-2023 Alumni Survey Report

May 3, 2024



Executive Summary

This report summarizes the results of the 2022-2023 Tulsa Community College Alumni Survey. The survey is designed to assess the employment and educational status of graduating students six months after their program completion and most recent experience at Tulsa Community College. The survey also provides a method for graduates to evaluate their educational experiences in the context of life (e.g., work, continuing education, personal life) after their award. The survey was distributed to 2,433 graduates and 178 were returned yielding an 7.3% response rate.

This report provides a summary of all survey responses received from 2022-2023 graduates. Detailed results and response frequencies for each survey item are also presented.

- 2,829 degrees and certificates were awarded to 2,433 individuals during the 2022-2023 academic year.
- The credentials awarded to graduates include university transfer degrees (AA & AS) and workforce development degrees (AAS) and certificates, with the following breakdown of awarded degrees:
 - 73.2% were a university transfer degree (AA or AS).
 - o 26.8% were a workforce development credential (AAS or certificate).
- Alumni were asked about their current educational objectives.
 - o 56.7% of the respondents are continuing their education.
 - o 26.4% plan to continue, but are not yet enrolled.
 - o 16.9% do not plan to continue their education.
- Respondents were asked about their current employment status.
 - o 75.7% of respondents indicated that they were employed. Of those reporting as employed:
 - 73.0% were employed full-time, 27.0% part-time.
 - 86.9% were employed in Tulsa or Northeast Oklahoma.
 - 70.1% were working either in their major field or in an area that is closely related to their field of study at TCC.
 - o Of the respondents who provided an estimate of their annual salary, 54.4% indicated an annual income of \$30,000 or more per year.

- Alumni were asked to indicate the extent their TCC experience contributed to their knowledge, skills, and personal development in specific areas. Following are the percentage of those indicating either Very much or Quite a bit for each area.
 - Written communication 74.1%
 - Oral communication 78.3%
 - Interpersonal interactions 68.1%
 - Critical thinking 78.3%
 - o Problem solving 78.3%
 - Quantitative reasoning 78.3%
 - Teamwork or collaboration 66.9%
 - Personal responsibility 83.7%
 - Ethical decision making 70.5%
 - Diversity awareness 66.9%
 - o Civic responsibility 67.5%
- Alumni were asked to rate the quality of their relationships with various groups while at TCC. Following is the percentage of those indicating either **Excellent** or **Good** for each group.
 - Other students 88.0%
 - Instructors 95.8%
 - Administrators and staff from TCC offices 89.2%
- Alumni were asked to rate the quality of their educational experience at TCC.
 - o 65.7% indicated they were **Very satisfied** with the overall educational experience at TCC.
 - 64.5% indicated they would definitely enroll at TCC if they were starting college again.
 - 75.3% indicated they would **definitely** recommend TCC to others.
 - o 65.6% characterized the preparation received at TCC for further study at another college or university as either **Exceptional** or **Better than adequate**.
 - o 47.0% characterized the preparation received at TCC for employment in their major field as either **Exceptional** or **Better than adequate**.
- Of the Alumni respondents, 74.7% indicated they had attended another college. Of those who had attended another college, 91.1% indicated the quality of education offered at TCC was **Better** than or **About the Same** as they received elsewhere.
- ❖ The comparison of the average response to scaled items between the 2022-2023 survey and the 2021-2022 showed only slight variations from year to year.

Method

Students were offered an incentive to participate consisting of a chance to win one of sixteen \$50 Amazon gift cards provided by the Tulsa Community College Foundation. Reminder emails were sent to students weekly including a mention of the gift card incentive provided by the TCC Foundation. All surveys were coded with a unique identifier that served as a link between the survey responses and Banner system data for the purpose of reporting. In addition, the index was used for the gift card drawings at the close of the survey cycle. A total of 178 survey responses were collected representing an 7.3% respons rate. For comparison, the 2021-2022 Alumni Survey response rate was 8.3%.

All responses from the 2022 - 2023 Academic Year (Summer 2022, Fall 2022, Spring 2023) were aggregated for this report.

Survey Results

Although 178 surveys were returned, some respondents did not complete all survey items. The tables below report the number (N) and percentage (%) of responses for each item on the survey.

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Comments concerning student services of a negative nature (9)*

Could use more support when it came to financial aid

I was switched around from one advisor to the next and it was beyond frustrating. My first few semesters were with XXXX and she was amazing at her job and had a rapport with me. Then I was passed around from one advisor to the next and a few of them enrolled me in classes that I had already taken or I did not need. The lack of coherent advisement made my transition to OSU a bit more difficult than I had anticipated.

I wish other campuses had amenities and events like the main campuses. I didn't have many of the opportunities in the Riverside campus compared to the other ones (unless I wanted to make the long journey). I wish we had giveaways, seminars, clubs, etc.

My financial aid experience completely ruined my whole experience at TCC. I fought for years to get the financial aid department to give the financial aid that I was owed. The whole department needs to be educated about their job. Too many students cannot finish school because the financial aid department cannot and will not help them. Please reach out to me anytime if you actually care to correct the problems within the financial aid department.

One concern for me is still having a balance after graduation, because I can't afford it. I was suspended from my aid my last semester. It stressed me out and really took a lot from me being excited for the moment of finishing school. I wasn't able to work full time and pay my balance. I didn't fail any classes the prior semester. So I'm still confused on how I was left with a balance after my appeal. I stressed about that in my appeal, and how it was my last semester and I would've been grateful to not have to worry about a balance. It's really discouraging for my future plans.. I am stuck with a balance, and I can't have any access to a transcript that I worked hard for until it's paid in full. It sucks because I can't even apply to nursing school until I get it. I feel like the staff should take that more into consideration when it comes to balances. We are already barely making it yet we still try to better ourselves by going to school only to be stuck with a balances that's unrealistic while trying to pay bills with the bare minimum. TCC seems very money hungry, they care about money more than their students, and alumni.

One of the biggest problems about Tcc was that the time for processing, as well as the organization of the administration is very bad. I was reversed, transferring my my classes from North Eastern State University to Tulsa community college, and there was a problem which would not allow me to do it. However, when I looked into it, I found out that the problem was about community service hours, which I had already taken care of almost a year prior. For this reason, I was not able to get a diploma from Northeastern State University, because on my audit it did not show that I had completed on classes. I was applying to medical school during this time and if I had needed to graduate, then it would've been a big problem. My brother also has had a problem with the financial office. For some reason, even though he is a nonworking student, they still want a W-2 form. The lack of organization and leader ship in the financial aid administrative teams worries, me because it could end up hurting someone's chances to getting into a bettter a University or job.

The academic advisors were hard to get in touch with quickly. If you could wait two weeks for an answer then you were fine.

The advisement office made me take an extra semester because they didn'tt know what they were talking about and I've talked to at least 10 other people who said the same. It's a problem that shouldn't be overlooked any longer, it's costing students precious time and money

The one area that I felt needed improvement was career services. I told them I was disabled which limited what I could physically do. The careers they suggested were not compatible with my disability. They did not help me figure out a career that I could do with my disability. I felt like I wasn't heard.

Comments concerning programs or instruction of a positive nature (3)*

Comments concerning programs or instruction of a negative nature (2)*

Online classes lacked in many ways. All tests and assignments were open book and there were no practical applications whatsoever. I feel I learned very little from them and wasted my time and money on those courses, when I have learned more on my own.

The only real complaint I have is that medical programs are not geared toward adult students. I would love to see nursing offered evenings or online, with clinical options for evenings or weekends. The US is pretty messed up economically and having no part time, evening, or online options is seriously not keeping up with the employment situation in Oklahoma or the US.

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
